Aimee is suffering from a severe case of Demodex mange that has caused her to lose 70% of the hair on her body. She also has a terrible secondary skin infection. This sweet puppy spent the first four months of her life in pain and complete neglect. Now safe at AHS, Aimee has been started on pain medication, antibiotics and medicine to kill the mites.



She will need extensive veterinary care but her condition is treatable. Despite everything she has been through, Aimee is a happy puppy who loves toys, bones, treats and especially people! She loves cuddling and giving kisses. 
erry was just a tiny 10 week old pup when she arrived at Animal House Shelter from Animal Control in Indiana. Happy and full of life, she

went to a foster home to get her vaccines, her spay and then she be ready to go up for adoption.

When she went to our vet to get spayed they heard a significant heart murmur and told us that she would need X-rays, complete bloodwork and ultrasound at a specialist to assess the condition of her heart. The specialist then diagnosed her with PDA and this poor little

girl was going to need open heart surgery to fix it or she would not live a long healthy life.

Patent ductus arteriosus (PDA) is the most common congenital heart disease in dogs. The ductus arteriosis is a normal structure that is present in



Failure of the ductus arterioles to close beyond 7-10 days of age is considered abnormal in dogs. This means an increased volume of blood is sent to the lungs which results in fluid build-up and eventually congestive heart failure. Premature death is likely without treatment.


We need your help with Merry! With the PDA surgery, Merry should live a normal, happy life - running and swimming like Labradors love to do!

A kind Samaritan found this poor little 6 month old Am Staff Terrier puppy wandering the streets in Southern Illinois. She was disoriented and bleeding profusely from her head. The kind stranger immediately rushed her to the vet where, luckily, they were able to save Sally's life. The vet said Sally was a victim of animal cruelty. Someone had held her down and without any anesthesia



or pain medication, cut off her ears with scissors, most likely to use her as bait in dog fighting. Once they realized that Sally wouldn't stop bleeding, they didn't want to get her any medical treatment so they threw her out onto the streets to die. Sally recently arrived at Animal House Shelter and we are amazed with her progress and temperament. She is very affectionate, well behaved, and loves other dogs and children. Caeden's Sad Story Gives Hope

Caeden had a traumatic and horrifying experience. He and his siblings were put in a shoe box and abandoned on a front porch step. The box was completely duct taped shut. As an afterthought to get them some air (at



least that is what we choose to believe) an ice pick was used to poke holes in the box. The little girl was killed by the pick and the boys were in the box at least 2 days before being discovered by the returning homeowner! They had no food or water and were covered in feces and urine. It is a wonder they survived. But

Caeden, with his sweet personality fully intact, still had work to do. He was adopted by Trish, a special education teacher who brought Caeden in as a therapy animal. Even though he was just a kitten and could be wild and rambunctious, he turned out to be an amazing therapy cat! He just lays limp as the children pick him up and pass him around. Caeden's story is a lesson that resonates with children who have survived trauma. He now visits the children two times a week and goes with Trish to pet stores, on road trips and walks on a leash.

Traffic had come to a stop on a road near Terre Haute. A kitten had been hit by a car and the little gray momma cat was standing guard with her two surviving babies. Animal Control had to physically remove the three then deliver them to the nearby Humane Society. There Iris continued to care for her two babies but soon her tiny family grew bigger. Four young orphans were found nearby and they desperately needed a momma. Iris accepted them immediately! She groomed them and began nursing as if they had been hers all along. Her two babies, Clover and Cosmo, seemed happy with the arrangement too, although there were a few adjustments to be made at mealtime. This lovely little family is now safe in an AHS foster home and soon will be ready for adoption.
