Angel was chained outside, living under a shed with nothing but garbage to eat. She was being bred over and over again with no regard for her health or well-being so that her owners could



Help Lady Find a Home for Help Us Treat Heartworm the Holidays



Animal House Shelter rescues all breeds of dogs and cats regardless of age, behavior, or health condition. In addition to the day-today costs of all animals in our care, we incur many expensive medical bills for the treatment and rehabilitation of injured and special needs animals. Beautiful Lady, a 2-year-old Border Collie/Boxer mix, is one such example. Lady tore the anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in her right hind leg. This painful injury must be corrected with surgery which is estimated to cost \$2,000. We are hoping to raise the funds so that Lady can have her surgery. Lady will need a home to recover in after the surgery. Please give us a call if you are interested in fostering Lady or would like to give her a permanent home in time for the holidays.

ne in every ten dogs that is rescued by Animal House Shelter is heartworm positive. Heartworm is a completely treatable (and preventable) disease. Unfortunately, many of the animals in our care have suffered neglect at the hands of their former owners and were

not kept on the simple monthly preventative that would have protected them from this deadly parasite. We treat over 300 cases of heartworm every vear which costs \$500-\$2,000 per dog depending on the size of the



dog and the severity of the infection. Because of this cost, many other shelters do not take in dogs that test positive for heartworm, leaving the animal control facilities in which they are housed no choice but to euthanize them. Please make a donation to help AHS continue to take in and treat heartworm positive dogs so that we can give them the chance at a long life in a loving home.

Moms Matter Too

any shelters take in litters of puppies and kittens, but will leave the moms behind because they are less adoptable or have other medical issues that need to be resolved before they are ready for adoption. Animal House always takes mothers with their babies even if they are no longer nursing. We also rescue moms left behind by other rescue groups. Please become a foster home today to help AHS show these mothers the care that they deserve and the commitment to finding them, as well as their babies, forever homes. Animal House Shelter rescues over 3,000 dogs and cats each year. A nimal House Shelter held our first ever online calendar photo contest from October 5th – October 29th, and it was a big hit! 294 photos were entered, nearly 650 people participated by entering and voting, and thousands more followed the contest on social media. The top 30 photos are included in Animal House Shelter's 2017 calendar with the cover going to the top photo, Elsie and her kittens, which received an outstanding 869 votes. Elsie, pregnant with four kittens, had been dumped in a subway station in the Bronx. She was rescued and driven to AHS by Nathan Hughes (aka Dakota's Dad) a supporter and adopter of the shelter. On August 15, 2016, the day after she arrived at her foster home, Elsie gave birth to her kittens which were named after the cities she traveled for rescue: Bronx, Elizabeth, Jersey, and Huntley. Elsie was adopted on October 29th, and the kittens went up for adoption on November 5th.
