Lucky is Fighting for Her Life

S weet little Lucky arrived at Animal House Shelter when a good Samaritan brought her to us having found her on the side of the road. We immediately rushed her to the vet who advised us to get her to the emergency clinic, as she was going to need round the



clock care for the next few days if she has any hope of surviving. They believe she has probably been out wandering in the snow and freezing temperatures for at least 3-4 weeks. She had a huge, infected abscess on her shoulder that was most likely from a wild animal biting into her neck and shaking her trying to kill her. A drainage tube had to be implanted in the wound to remove infection. Lucky is extremely anemic and the most ema-

ciated dog the vet has ever seen that is still breathing. She is only

18 weeks and can't even walk. Lucky is truly the perfect name for this little girl. We are so happy that we are able to give her a fighting change, but we need donations to cover the cost of her care. Please donate if you can! This poor little girl deserves a chance at life!



Louie Deserves a Chance

ouie was found outside by a good Samaritan. She took him to her vet who treated an upper respiratory infection he had but also discovered that Louie was FIV positive. The FIV virus, like HIV in humans, is not deadly, but makes it harder for the individual to fight infections. Louie makes some strange noises when he breathes and sometimes coughs when purring. The vets believed this may be caused by a polyp so he went to The University of Wisconsin Veterinary Clinic where he was put under anesthesia and scoped. Much to the surprise of the UW veterinarians and AHS staff, no polyp

was found. What they did discover was that his turbinates were very inflamed, his hard palate abnormally long and soft palate was very flaccid which causes his breathing to sound funny and purr cough. They started him on a course of steroids to calm down the inflammation and we are pleased to report that he is responding beautifully! The U of W clinicians gave AHS a discount on his expenses and

Hero Wants to Survive

ero is a very sweet, loving, 3 year old Boxer/ Bulldog mix who has a happy go lucky attitude despite the fact that his body is riddled with problems. He came to Animal House Shelter after spending three weeks at a pound in Southern IL where he had been found wandering with two of his littermates. One of his brothers died at the pound, presumably from a parasitic infection, and



Animal House Shelter rescued Hero and his littermate Sully so that they would not suffer a similar fate. Both Hero and Sully had tested positive for heart worm. (most shelters won't take in dogs with this condition due to the great expense involved in treating them.) Shortly after their arrival, the staff at AHS noticed a large lump under Hero's jaw, visible from the outside, and could see a bubblelike abscess when looking inside his open mouth. The vet diagnosed him with a sialocoele, which is a collection of saliva that has leaked from a damaged salivary gland, and has accumulated in the tissues of his mouth. This causes a swelling in the neck and oral cavity which will continue to grow until the gland is

surgically removed. Hero's surgery alone is estimated to cost \$2,500.00 or more. He also needs to be treated for Heartworm, estimated to cost at least \$400.00 and these are treatments that Sully is in need of as well. Please consider making a donation to help us take care of Hero and Sully, and to give them the chance at life that their poor third sibling never had.

Save Alaska!

A laska was rescued by Animal House Shelter with her litter of 6 week old puppies. She had been dumped at a high kill shelter by her owner because she was pregnant and he didn't want to 'deal with it.' She was doing her best to take

care of her family and, quite literally, every ounce of strength she had she was giving to her puppies. She came to us looking like a skeleton struggling to keep the bellies of her



little ones full. Almost the moment the puppies were weaned her poor depleted body collapsed and she was rushed to the emergency vet by her foster mom. Alaska spent over a week in intensive care at the emergency clinic fighting for her life. Her white blood cell count was down to nearly 0, she had a fever of 106, a terrible infection in her mammary glands and both of her lungs had collapsed. She had to be placed



on a respirator to keep her breathing and she was hanging on to life by the smallest of threads. This brave girl is a fighter, however, and despite the grim prognosis from the vet, AHS knew not to give up on her. A week later she was taken off of the breathing machine and her lungs started functioning on their own! She is on bed rest right now in her foster home and the

infection is going down but she is not out of the woods yet. Alaska's stay at the emergency clinic has cost the shelter well over \$5000.00 and we still are trying to raise the funds to pay her bill. Alaska thanks you!

Help Sprinkles Breathe Easy

Five month old Sprinkles and her 4 litter mates came from a kill shelter with respiratory infections. After a week went by, all of the other kittens' conditions had improved greatly but the medicine seemed to have no effect on Sprinkles and she was having trouble eating. Her

pupil was also abnormally dilated. The vet diagnosed her with Horner's syndrome which is most likely caused by a polyp in her nasal passage. Horner's Syndrome causes a disruption of the sympathetic nervous system which controls involuntary functions of the body such as digestion and

facial muscle function. Because of this, what she is able to eat is not being digested properly and she is rapidly losing weight. She is going to need to have her nasal passage scoped and surgery to remove the polyp or she will not survive. This procedure costs \$2400.00. Please consider making a donation to help Sprinkles, she is still just a baby and she deserves a change at a long life in a loving home.



Help Briggs Stand Strong

Briggs was adopted from Animal House Shelter 2 years ago when he was about a year old. He was just recently returned to the shelter because he had torn the cruciate ligament in both of his hind legs. His owners said they would rather end his life than consider the expense of the surgery he requires. He is going to require two ACL surgeries, each costing about \$2,500.00. We hope that you will make a contribution to Briggs' surgery fund so that he can run and play again soon with his doggy friends. Right now he has to be kenneled alone and cannot play with the other dogs because his legs are hurting him too much and he is quite depressed because he misses his family terribly.
