Babies In A Barn

Midnight and her puppies were found abandoned in a broken-down barn. Someone had once loved Midnight, but she was left to fend for herself for reasons we will never understand.

Scared and alone, Midnight soon found herself having puppies, with little shelter and no food or water for herself. Barely just skin and bones, she put her puppies lives ahead of her own, protecting her babies with everything she had left in her. Midnight was at the brink of losing her life, all so that her babies had a chance at a future when the family was rescued and brought to Animal House Shelter for a new start to their lives. Midnight and her puppies are slowly recovering in foster care while looking for a place they can call home.

Robert

Robert came to Animal House Shelter in early October with what we originally thought was a simple broken leg. However, we soon found out the horrible truth: Robert's leg had a multitude of fractures, most likely caused by being run over with a car, fully crushing his leg. Due to the nature of the injury, Robert was at a high risk of needing amputation. He needed a foster that was



willing to perform physical therapy several times a day in an effort to save his leg. Luckily, one of our wonderful fosters stepped up to the plate. She reports that despite all that he's gone through, Robert is a sweet, loving little boy that will make a wonderful addition to any family. Only time will tell if Robert will keep his leg, so keep up with his story by following our Facebook page.

All Mixed Up



Did you know an animal can be born with their organs in all the wrong places? That's what happened to Darla, a special 2 year old calico cat who came to us from a high-kill shelter where she was set to be euthanized. After being rescued, she arrived at our shelter scared and barely able to breathe. We were worried she wouldn't make it through the night so we rushed her to the vet right away. After examination, the vet informed us that her stomach was where her liver should be and that her intestines were sitting on top of her chest, making it hard for her to breathe. The surgery was very risky, she could die on the surgery table and would cost \$1,100, but with Darla's life on the line, we decided the surgery was her best chance at having a long life. Darla survived the surgery and made an amazing recovery while in foster care. She is patiently waiting for that special family to adopt her.

We are expanding in order to save the lives of over 5,000 more each year, and we need your help!



Animal House Shelter takes in, cares for, and adopts out abused, neglected and abandoned animals, especially those scheduled for euthanasia at other shelters. Once rehabilitated and ready, these animals are carefully matched with prospective adopters and placed in loving homes.

Founded in Barrington in 2002, we moved to Huntley in 2006 and quickly outgrew our facility. Currently, we are transporting our animals between six different veterinary clinics in order to keep up with their medical needs. We are looking to build a state of the art vet clinic, on the shelter's property, to take care of all the animals coming to our organization from high-kill facilities throughout the year. The cost of their care would be offset greatly if we had our own vet clinic to care for their needs and we would then be able to rescue and re-home a far greater number of animals.

In addition to caring for the animals we rescue, we will be providing low-cost vaccinations, microchips, and neutering to all communities in the Northwest suburbs of Chicago to provide services to those who would otherwise not be able to afford them.



Some of the services our clinic will offer include:

- Vaccinations
- Heartworm Treatments
- Spays & Neuters
- X-Rays
- Microchips
- Fecals



Training Center

At our training center, we will have the chance to offer a wide range of on-site pet training classes.



Bonding Rooms

The new bonding rooms will help adopters meet and interact with their next potential pet in a safe and quiet space.



Education Center

The Education Center will give us the ability to offer a variety of classes and uses for our community's children.



New Facility Exterior

The exterior of our new facility will be surrounded by a Bird and Butterfly Garden, as well as the Farmstead Silo Memorial Garden. Not only will these be beautiful additions to the facility, but they will offer a way for the community to remember and memorialize their loved ones.

Memorial Trees

A Memorial Tree is a long-lasting opportunity to honor and remember a loved one. At the same time, it helps improve the beauty and quality of the Animal House Shelter grounds. Animal House Shelter has chosen Sugar Maple and Red Oak for the memorial program. A 30-gallon tree is standard, but a larger tree can be installed at a higher cost.

Trees will be planted between May 1 and October 1. You may select a specific location for your tree donation from the list on the application. The tree's exact location will be determined by Animal House Shelter. Donors will be notified once a tree has been planted and made aware of its location. Animal House Shelter cannot guarantee a specific planting date.

You may choose a memorial tree with or without an accompanying bronze marker.

In Memory of / In Loving Memory of / In Honor of Bob Smith June 5, 1942 - January 7, 2010






Dawn




Senior lady Dawn is one tough cookie. Imagine how scary it would be moving from place to place and not being able to hear or see! That is what Dawn has been going through
