Since opening our doors in 2002, Animal House Shelter has rescued over 48,000 homeless animals providing them with shelter, veterinary care, and love until they can find a forever home. Many of these animals come from abusive homes and our shelter is a haven for them, when they need it most. This is only made possible through the generous funding we have received from caring animal supporters like you. This year we are specifically seeking donations to fund our facility expansion project.



Animal House Goes International

Animal House Shelter has partnered with Humane Society International to help rescue dogs from dog meat farms in South Korea. That's right.... dogs raised for human consumption!! While all animals nationwide and internationally need help, we decided to open our shelter to these babies who were among nearly 200 dogs and puppies rescued from a South Korean dog meat farm that the Humane Society International shut down last month. These animals were in heart-wrenching condition when they arrived to AHS. One dog, named Heidi, needed to have one of her eyes and several teeth removed because of infections that had been long neglected. Other dogs were malnourished and will need work on socialization to heal from their past lives.

Once rescued, these dogs typically need a lot of rehabilitation and medical care. WE CAN'T DO THIS WORK WITHOUT YOUR HELP. Please consider donating to Animal House Shelter. Dean is a shy, handsome little boy who's living in a cage at AHS, while all his litter mates have gone to loving homes. The volunteers have been giving him lots of attention and



affection, which he seems to enjoy. But, he still needs someone with much love to give and lots of patience to bring him totally out of his shell.

Chad & Charlie are a bonded pair of sweet 8 year old's who were adopted as kittens & just recently given up by their owner. On a special diet, they are confined to a large cage in the cat room, hoping that someone will open their hearts and give them a truly forever home.

Ginny came to Animal House Shelter with two of her puppies, Valentino and Sweetheart. When she was evaluated upon arrival, we learned she had been severely beaten. Poor Ginny had front shoulder damage, broken ribs and her front leg will need to be amputated as it can no longer function; it just dangles. According to our vet, such horrific injuries could only have been caused by repeated abuse. Ginny is a sweet girl and is starting to trust us but, understandably, she is still very timid. With time, healing and lots of love we know her personality will shine through. We look forward to seeing her placed into a forever home.
